Per your request, below is a breakdown of the most current report on incarceration and probation rates for the State of Oregon. This data has some caveats attached.

First, the data source we are now (all felony DOC admissions in 2005) using is not the same as we used in the past (sentencing reports made directly to the Criminal Justice Commission). Second, the data only shows a cumulative probation vs. incarceration rate versus a breakdown of which crimes actually received probation vs. incarceration.
